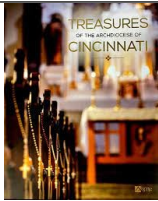

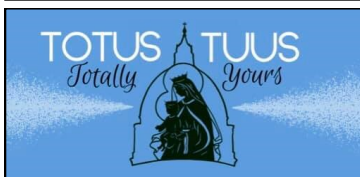

**Transition to Safe Parish** - For many years the Archdiocese of Cincinnati has used the VIRTUS program for safe environment training. However, the archdiocese plans to switch from VIRTUS to SafeParish. SafeParish will send emails to all current VIRTUS account holders with instructions for registering on the SafeParish website. SafeParish will match information entered by each user to data transferred from the VIRTUS database to identify the user and transfer information from their VIRTUS account including background check, B4, training, and monthly bulletin information to their SafeParish account.

**What this means for you:** If you are already trained in VIRTUS and current on your monthly bulletins you don't need to do anything except create a new account with SafeParish. As stated above, you will receive an email in early July instructing you how to do that. Your new SafeParish account will indicate that you are up-to-date on your bulletins and you will simply continue to complete the bulletins, which will be quarterly instead of monthly. If you are not current on your bulletins, please catch up on those so that you will not be marked as behind when the changeover occurs.
